The Survey Says...

Thank you to everyone who completed the on-line and paper versions of the uniform survey. I want you to know that the committee appreciates hearing your views and that you have been heard. Results of the survey are summarized below:

Identify yourself – 690 students responded to the paper survey and the results were collated by Mrs. McLean's Data Management class. It seems our grade 11s were the most interested in responding and also (surprisingly given the two questions specific to the girl's uniform) a higher proportion of male students – 430 of them – took the time to respond. 546 responded to the on-line survey, 440 parents and 68 staff and a smattering of students and 'others'. The largest group on-line were grade 10 parents.

Footwear – Among students, over 80% approved of changing the footwear policy and 56% approved of the definition, allowing alternate colours and styles. Among on-line respondents, 54% approved of changing the policy and over 70% approved of the definition.

Pants – Definitive results here! 93% of female student respondents wanted a new style of pants. Even the males were on board at 75%. The on-line survey came in at 85% in favour. We have already begun this process and samples are circulating at the school.

Kilt – Again, a definitive result. Of the student responses, 83% of females preferred keeping the kilt as an option. Overall, 69% of students want to keep the kilt. On-line, 60% of respondents want to keep the kilt. It is interesting to read the "Responses" for while the majority wish to retain the kilt, many, many parents and staff expressed frustration with how the kilt is being worn.

Please note that the next step in the process is to revise the Holy Cross Uniform Policy in light of these results. The committee meets in January and a copy of a draft revision will be published in next month's newsletter and on the school website (www.hctoday.ca). While there is no formal process for collecting your input on the rewritten policy, please feel free to contact the school with any concerns. And once again, thanks for your insights and input.

EQAO Assessment of Grade 9 Math

In January, all Holy Cross students enrolled in grade 9 mathematics, along with their colleagues throughout the province, will complete a standardized 60 minute math test that includes multiple choice, short answer and extended response questions. The test is administered across the province on January 14th and 16th. This assessment is integrated into both academic and applied level courses and teachers at Holy Cross have already been preparing students. January Examination Period Reminders

You will find the January Examination Schedule posted on HC Today. Exams are scheduled for 8:30 and for 12:00 noon start times. School cancellation will cause the schedule to 'bump' one day: exams cancelled due to weather will happen the following day. Please check all media if we experience bad weather, but when in doubt, expect to write! **Textbooks** must be returned to the textbook room before a student's last examination in order for staff to process, catalogue inventory and reissue to semester two students. This avoids "lost" textbook issues and makes life easier for everyone involved in the turn-around from semester one to semester two. Textbooks for semester two are available for pick up during the examination schedule and before school, at lunch hour and after school once classes start in February. Students will need their green library/ textbook card. (Replacement cards are \$5.00.)

Examination Return Day is February 2nd. We will be following an abbreviated Semester 2 schedule that day where students cycle through semester one classes to get examinations and then travel to their new classes to meet teachers and receive course orientations.

OSSLT – Literacy Test

The **O**ntario **S**econdary **S**chools **L**iteracy **T**est has been scheduled for Thursday, March 26th, 2015. All grade 10 students working toward a graduation diploma will write, along with senior students new to Ontario or unsuccessful writers from last year. Grade 9 students will write a practice literacy test that day and our senior students will be on independent study.

Final Exams: Students on IEPs are entitled to their regular accommodations during the exam period. Students and their parents who do not wish to access these provided accommodations are asked to discuss this with the individual subject teacher and of course, their Special Education Resource Teacher.

The final IEP for semester one will reflect any changes made during the term as a result your comments on the Consultation Form, parent-teacher/guardian interviews, notes from medical professionals, guidance meetings, phone calls, assessment reports, IPRC meetings, case conferences. This final version, no longer draft, will be attached to the semester one provincial report card which students will receive on February 6. As we begin the draft IEP process for semester two, please continue to give us your input as partners in your child's academic success. If there is anything of a very important nature that

you would like included in the **IEP Transition Plan** for increased success for next semester, please contact us.

Post-Secondary Transition Planning: Grade 12 Students and their parents and Guardians are invited to prepare a Post-Secondary Transition Portfolio. On-Line to Success Program-RARC-Queen's University: This program is for students in grades 11 and 12 with a Learning Disability (LD), Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). It is primarily an on-line course, however, there are three in-person workshop days (Opening Days: March 26 & 27, Closing Day: May 14) Students who complete this course are eligible for a discounted assessment (\$1000 or less) before postsecondary. There is no cost to the program. however transportation is not provided to the three days on Queen's campus. The registration deadline is January 20.
