

Examinations on the Horizon

The examination season is upon us, and with it comes added pressure on staff and students. Deadlines for the completion of course work, culminating tasks, studying, increasing hours for students with part-time work—it all adds up to stress and anxiety. And that stress and anxiety often spills over into the home. We are here to help. The week before examinations is a review and culminating task week. **No new curriculum will be introduced during the final week of classes**. Guidance Counsellors and Youth Workers are available for students who need help managing the end of semester timelines. Subject teachers will provide course review work in every class at Holy Cross.

Parents and family have a role to play as well. The final examination schedule will be published shortly on our website. **Wednesday, January 27th to Tuesday February 2nd, 2016** are the provincially mandated days for examinations. Please avoid scheduling events on those school days. But things do happen. Legitimate reasons for absence include medical, family emergency, or inclement weather. Please know that medical exemptions must be supported with a doctor's note specifying "exemption from examination" due to the particular reason. The school will work with students to complete necessary assessments so that credits may be granted. Our guiding principles are fairness and academic integrity.

And the Survey Says... Graduation Survey Results

Question 1: identify yourself — 22% graduates; 6% student; 53% parent; 18% staff.

Question 2: I would like to keep the June graduation ceremony in the Holy Cross gym for 2015-6 - 45% Yes; 55% No Question 3: At the graduation ceremony, my family will need -2 seats, 7%; 4 seats, 32%; 6 seats, 31%; more than 6 seats, 30%.

Question 4: I would support increasing the fee paid by graduating students (presently \$25) to cover the cost of moving off site—by \$15, 25%; by \$25, 30%; by \$35, 13%; I do not support a fee increase and prefer staying on site, 31%.

Question 5: The start time that would best suit my family would be -4:00 pm, 20%; 5:00 pm, 16%; 6:00 pm, 43%; 7:00 pm 21%.

Please Note: This survey will be used by our graduation committee to plan for this year's ceremony and subsequent graduation ceremonies. Decisions made by the committee will be based on many factors, not just the wishes of staff, parents and students

This important study has been approved by the Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board and has already been implemented in a number of our elementary schools. Parents will be informed with a letter home in early January. The study is entirely voluntary and entirely confidential. If you wish to opt out, just let us know. PRO Grant Speake

Sami Jo Small will be speaking at Holy Cross on February 16th to our students in the morning, and to our parents in the evening. She currently works as a motivational speaker as well as an instructor at her hockey school. She still plays competitive hockey for the Toronto Furies. She grew up playing on the outdoor hockey rinks of Winnipeg, MB. Her passion for the game was honed in the boys' minor hockey system. As the only girl she was forced each and every day to prove that she belonged through hard work and determination. She dreamt, like her teammates, of someday playing in the NHL, but also dreamt of someday stepping on to the podium at the Olympic Games.

At Stanford University for track and field, injuries led to a return to hockey. She played on the Stanford Men's team, garnering PAC-10 MVP honours while earning her degree in mechanical engineering. Ultimately, her childhood dream became a reality when she accepted a spot on the 1998 Olympic Games team traveling to Nagano, Japan. Women's hockey was on the rise and Sami Jo was a huge part of its success. She has since won five World Championships and has twice been named Championship MVP. She is a three time Olympian and has been a member of two Olympic Gold Medal Winning teams. We look forward to her visit and thank our school council, led by Michelle Iliescu, for their work in bringing Sami to Holy Cross.



Dear Parent or Guardian:

We would like to invite you to be part of a new study looking into the ability of video games to reduce levels of anxiety in children and adolescents. This study, MindLight, is being conducted by Dr. Tom Hollenstein from Queen's University, Isabela Granic from Radboud University in Nijmegen, Netherlands, and Dr. Sarosh Khalid-Khan from Queen's University and the Mood and Anxiety Clinic at Hotel Dieu Hospital in Kingston, Ontario. The Mindlight study has been approved by the Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board and the Research Ethics Board at Queen's University.

As a first step, we will be distributing a brief questionnaire to determine eligibility of youth in grades 9-10 at Holy Cross Catholic Secondary School. This questionnaire will indicate how often and to what degree your child experiences feelings of anxiety. Experiencing some anxiety is normal and expected for everyone. From taking tests to presenting in public, anxiety is something we all experience at some point in our lives. The purpose of this study is to help youth manage their feelings of anxiety through engaging computer-based programs.

If your child is eligible, we will send you information about the study and how you can contact the study coordinator if you are interested. You and your child are under no obligation to participate. If you do not wish to have your child participate in the questionnaire, please contact us directly, or contact your child's school.
