Principal's Message

November has been a busy month. I have just completed feeder school visits with our Student Success Lead, Mrs. Besselink, and based on the reports by grade 8 teachers and the enthusiasm demonstrated, I predict the class of 2021 is going to be fantastic. Our annual *Day of the Arts* at Holy Cross, where feeder schools are introduced to our Arts program, November 28 and 29, were very well received by our elementary partner schools. *Les Miserable* is a wonderful accomplishment, in the long and illustrious tradition of our Art Department, which can't seem to do anything that isn't excellent. I hope you have a chance to see it. We also had two athletic championships to celebrate—Sr. Girls' Basketball, over LaSalle, and Field Hockey, over Frontenac. Both great victories. The field hockey team, featured above, qualified for the playoffs at the all Ontario championships in Kitchener but lost a hard fought game in the quarterfinals. The Senior Girls' team, led by Coach Dixon, won the consolation gold medal at OFSSA in Scarborough, losing only one game in the tournament.

Our Boys' volleyball program is taking off, our cross country team went to EOSSAA, both football teams were one step away from the finals, ultimate Frisbee won silver — all of our athletic programs speak to the quality of our coaching and the efforts and talents of our student-athletes. Winter sports are now up and running so pay attention to the electronic message boards or sign up for direct feeds to your portable device for more information.

Parents should be aware that second semester timetables for many students will have to be updated and potentially adjusted due to increased enrolment and the creation of new classes. While potentially disruptive, this situation is good news. It allows us to balance classes, decrease the student to teacher ratio and generally improve the classroom experience for all those involved. I delivered this information to School Council on November 11th and at that time your parent representatives on council expressed concerns on behalf of the community about this state of affairs. The work of balancing classes will begin following a review of grade 12 enrolment for semester 2, in December. Please know that our guiding principle is minimizing the disruption to student timetables. Teachers may change, the periods in which courses are offered may change, but courses that students are enrolled in now will not change, unless by request. If you have any concerns, please contact us.

As the season of Advent will be upon us by the time this newsletter reaches you, let me take this opportunity to wish you and your family blessings during this very special time of the year. May your December be full of hope and happiness.

Holy Cross School Council welcomes Dr. Matt Bellace, Ph.D., speaker, psychologist, comedian on Tuesday February 21st, 2017.



With support from Parent Reaching Out Grants, and in collaboration with our elementary school partners, the Holy Cross School Council has arranged to have Dr. Matt Bellace, PhD, speaker, psychologist and comedian, address our community on Tuesday February 21st, 2017 at 7:00pm. Holy Cross will host this free parent information event, open to all parents, staff and interested members of our community. Dr. Bellace will explain the impact of substance use on teen brain develop-

ment, describe the science behind healthy coping mechanisms, and will offer strategies to more effectively communicate with teens around sensitive issues. Dr. Bellace will also address students during the day about healthy choices and 'natural highs' aiming to empower them to be leaders in their lives and make changes in their environment. Dr. Bellace will highlight the basic science behind natural highs such as running, laughing, and helping others and will have students identify their own natural highs and the value of using them to cope with stress. High School Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)

The KFL&A Public Health Unit, in cooperation with the Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board, has established a timeline for the completion of student immunizations. Wednesday, January 11, 2017—KFL&A Public Health sends letter home to students with incomplete immunization records. School receives list.

<u>Wednesday</u>, <u>February 8</u>, <u>2017</u>—Deadline for families to report to KFL&A Public Health Immunization Team that the student's immunizations are up to date.

<u>Wednesday</u>, <u>February 15</u>, <u>2017</u>—KFL&A Public Health sends an Order of Suspension from Attendance at School to families who have not met the immunization requirements as set out under the ISPA.

Monday, March 6th, 2017—KFL&A Public Health faxes to schools a list of students to be suspended under the ISPA on Tuesday, March 28th, 2017 with a letter to be sent home with students.

<u>Thursday, March 23, 2017</u> and again on <u>Monday, March 27, 2017</u> – Updated lists of overdue students are faxed to schools in preparation for suspension on March 28th.

<u>Tuesday, March 28th, 2017</u>—School suspensions enacted and remain in place for 20 days or until the up to date immunization record is received by KFL&A Public Health.

Please note: An immunization clinic will be held at KFL&A Public Health on Portsmouth Avenue, Kingston, on the morning of Tuesday, March 28, from 9:00 to 11:30 am. Rescind notices will be issued at this clinic. allowing students to return to school immediately.

Community Clean Up

Every year, in the spring, the students of Holy Cross, led by our Green Team, participate in a community clean up. Students volunteer their time to pick up trash and debris on our property and on the surrounding properties. One of the issues that arises without fail, is garbage along Woodbine Road, discarded as students travel to and from the local restaurants at Bayridge Drive and Princess Street. Other problem areas are the local parks at Lancaster and at Dunham Street along the walking paths. Holy Cross is a Gold Certified Eco school and we do everything we can to control waste on our site. Students are encouraged, while off campus, to follow the same environmentally sound practices they do while here at school. Please be mindful of our neighbours and keep our neighbourhood clean.

Last year, 69% of our students working at the applied level achieved the provincial standard on this assessment. 82% of students working at the academic level achieved the standard. 

Course Changes for Semester Two

Students intending to make changes in their Semester Two time-table are asked to do so by Friday, December 16th.

College/University Applications

Post-secondary application workshops and information sessions have concluded. Although the deadline for applications to OUAC (University) is January 11th and OCAS (College) is February 1st, the Holy Cross recommended date is December 15th All PIN numbers for university applicants have arrived, and students should have stopped by Student Services to pick up theirs. PIN numbers are not required for college applications; however, students do require their OEN number which can be found on their report card.

House of Commons Page Program

Grade 12 students accepted to a university in the National Capital Region with an academic average of 80% are eligible to apply to the House of Commons Page Program. Work begins in late August 2017, and the work schedule will be coordinated with their university schedule. Students must also speak fluent French to be eligible.
