

The Holy Cross 2017 Toronto Street Retreat Team with Br. John at St. Francis Table

2017 Toronto Street Retreat

Thirteen students and staff from Holy Cross took part in this year's Toronto Street Retreat, November 22-23. This retreat is designed to give students a firsthand experience of what life is like for the poor and homeless on the streets of our nation's biggest city. For most of the group, this was their first opportunity to meet and speak with a homeless person and to hear why thousands of youth and older men and women live on the streets due to poverty, alcoholism, drug addiction or mental illness. We especially enjoyed preparing and serving supper at St. Francis Table which is a Franciscan "Restaurant for the Poor and not a Soup Kitchen" according to Br. John, the Coordinator. As one of the students, Orim, wrote in her reflections on the trip, "The most memorable part of the street retreat for me was once we started serving the homeless at St. Francis Table and began to all enter a flow, working together to serve the less fortunate of God's children." We slept overnight at St. Patrick's Church and met the Pastor, Fr. Santos in a late night debrief in the church. We spent Thursday with Patrick Sullivan, a street worker at Sanctuary, a small church located one block from Bloor and Yonge Streets. Through his heartfelt sharing, we heard that Christ is present in every person, but especially in the poor. As Kendra, another student participant wrote in her reflections, "It was very eye opening and shows how much people don't know about what is happening ...". None of us will ever again be able to just sit back and enjoy our privileged lives knowing there are people out there who don't know where their next meal will be coming from. Special thanks to Youth Worker, Ms. Amey Cancian, and Religion Teacher, Mr. Jeff Brady, who came along as Staff Supervisors. And a big congratulations to our students who so bravely entered into the lives of the poor and homeless. May all of us continue to respond to God's call to be Good Samaritans to our brothers and sisters in need.

College/University Applications

Post-secondary application workshops and information sessions have concluded. Although the deadline for applications to **OUAC (University)** is **January 17th** and **OCAS (College)** is **February 1st**, the **Holy Cross** recommended date is **December 15th** All PIN numbers for university applicants have arrived, and students should have stopped by **Student Services** to pick up theirs. PIN numbers are not required for college applications; however, students do require their OEN number which can be found on their report card.

House of Commons Page Program

Grade 12 students accepted to a university in the National Capital Region with an academic average of 80% are eligible to apply to the House of Commons Page Program. Work begins in late August 2018, and the work schedule will be coordinated with their university schedule. Students must also speak fluent French to be eligible.
