




ARTS Update

Counsellor's Corner

Time table changes and course load:

All students in grade 9, 10, and 11 will carry a full course load which is 4 credits per semester. Students in grade 12 who have a minimum of 24 credits may elect to have a spare in each semester. All grade 12 students who have not graduated are required to carry a minimum of 3 courses each semester. It is the view of the school, that students fully engaged in the classroom will perform better academically and will progress to graduation with fewer challenges.

Students have until Friday, September 15 to request a timetable change. Students must meet with their guidance counsellor to discuss their request.

Post-secondary Information

Information sessions regarding post-secondary education will start next week. Students should regularly check the announcements for the presentation schedule. A monthly schedule is also posted in Student Services. Students interested in applying to University should plan on attending the information session on Wednesday, September 13 at 11:15 or at 2:30.
