**TEXTBOOK PICK-UP:** Please choose 1 of the following 2 options.

**1. A separate textbook deposit cheque in the amount of \$100.00, (post-dated to March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020) is required by each student before textbooks can be issued. The student's name should be clearly printed in the memo section of the cheque.**

This cheque will not be cashed if the student's books are returned in good condition at the end of each semester. **OR**

**2. Textbook deposit of \$100.00 payable online.**

This deposit will be refunded once the student's books are returned in good condition at the end of each semester. You also have the option to carry the deposit forward into the next semester/year.

## Parking Lot Safety

The safety of our students is a major concern at Holy Cross, so please pay attention to direction and speed restraints while driving in the school parking lot. The entrance to the school lot is at the east end of the school and the exit is at the west end. Please do not go in the out and vice versa. Reduce your speed while driving and watch for students. When dropping off and picking up students, do not block traffic flow. When possible, park in a designated parking space. Do not block the “No Parking” area or the handicap parking spaces in front of the school as these areas are needed by students with special needs as well as students crossing to get to the city bus stop. Finally, there is no parking in the laneway at the back of the school. This is for bus drop off and pick up only. Vehicles parked in the rear laneway not only delay the busses but also create a risk to students trying to get to their busses. Caution and consideration will make things better for all.





## **Attendance Procedures**

Regular attendance greatly improves a student's chances for success in school, and until a student is 18 it is their parent's/guardian's responsibility to ensure that they are in attendance daily. **If you student is going to be absent, please call the school** attendance line at 613-384-1919 extension 2 to notify the school and provide a general explanation for the absence. If we do not receive a call about an absence, an automated call will go home to remind you to verify that you are aware of the absence.

If a student will **not be in class due to a school activity**, such as a field trip, participation in a sporting event or the cancellation of busses due to weather, you do not need to contact the school.

**Occasionally a call will go home in error.** If you receive an absence call, and your student says they were there, or that they were at a school event, please call the attendance office so that we may look into the error, and ensure attendance is accurate.

Finally, **when a student reaches 10 or 15 absences in a course**, a letter will be sent to their home to ensure that parents/guardians are aware of the absence count. This count will include any absence that was not a school activity, even if the school was advised of the absence. These letters fulfill our duty of keeping parents/guardians informed. A student will not lose a credit based on absences alone, but an attendance counsellor will be advised to monitor further absences. Please try to keep absences less than 5 per term.

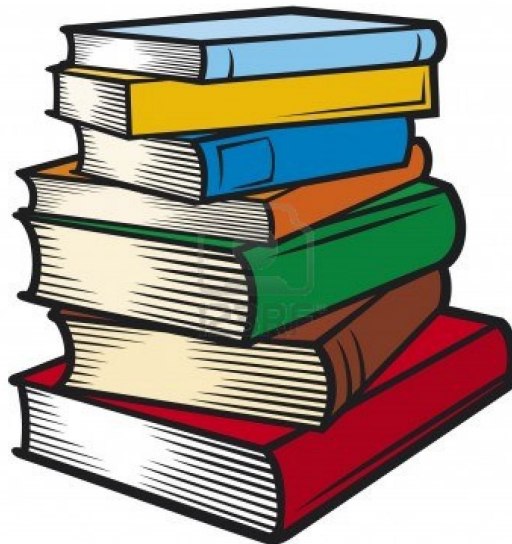

## **Time table changes and course load:**

All students in grade 9, 10, and 11 will carry a full course load which is 4 credits per semester. Students in grade 12 who have a minimum of 24 credits may elect to have a spare in each semester. All grade 12 students who have not graduated are required to carry a minimum of 3 courses each semester. It is the view of the school, that students fully engaged in the classroom will perform better academically and will progress to graduation with fewer challenges.

Students have until Friday, September 13 to request a timetable change. Students must meet with their guidance counsellor to discuss their request.
