## Principal's Message

Another school year is nearing completion, year two of virtual celebrations and limited options. Although the sun is shining more vibrantly every day, there is a heaviness upon us. The lockdown and all worries attached can be really trying on our resilience and optimism. Please know that anyone feeling this sadness is not alone and that there are better days ahead. We truly are in this together and, as more and more of us are vaccinated, the end is in sight. Hang in there.

The Holy Cross community lost a longtime and valued staff member, Educational Assistant Barb Storrington. **Barb** was a strong advocate for her students and also shared her many talents and gifts with her colleagues. So many people here are hurting right now, mourning her loss, but are grateful to have known her. We will plant a blue spruce tree near the outdoor classroom in her honour. Blue Spruce was a favourite of Barb's. We hope this space will honour her properly.

Like many organizations in Canada, our flags are flying at half-mast in honour of the **215 children**, uncovered in a mass grave at a residential school in Kamloops, BC. This serves as a stark reminder of the violence inflicted by the residential school system and by the Catholic church. It serves to remind us that the wounds carried by communities, families and residential school survivors is very much a present-day issue. We have parents in the Holy Cross community who have lived this intergenerational trauma and still entrust their children to our care. If we are indeed a Catholic school board where "all are welcome in this place", we have to ensure that all people are honoured, respected and feel safe. The flags are at half-mast as a symbol of unity but action remains. It is beyond time to put into place the recommendations of the TRC Final Report and to take responsibility, build

relationship, show respect, and enact mutual reciprocity.

## ***Moving On Up!***

### **A Jump Start to Grade 9**

Holy Cross will host an orientation program over 2 days during the week before school begins (tentative dates: **Tuesday, Aug. 31<sup>st</sup> & Wednesday, Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>**)

### Graduate Information

### **OUAC and OCAS**

Marks have been submitted to OUAC and OCAS. Students should check their account to make sure all information is accurate. Students must accept offers of admission in their OUAC and OCAS accounts, and they must do so by the published deadline dates provided by the post-secondary institutions.

### **OSAP**

Ontario has launched applications for the 2021-22 Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) for full-time students. Students can now apply to the OSAP program for the 2021-22 school year for help with their postsecondary education costs. Students who have questions about OSAP or the OSAP application can contact the Financial Aid Office at the college or university they plan to attend.

### **Community Service Requirement for Graduates**

For the 2021-22 school year, the Ministry of Education has revised the 40-hour community involvement graduation requirement so that students will not be adversely impacted by the ongoing challenges related to COVID-19. For students graduating this school year, the **community involvement graduation requirement will be reduced to a minimum of 20 hours** of community involvement activities. This recognizes that graduating students have had barriers to earning their community involvement hours last school year and there may be continued barriers this school year. Students can include activities that are performed at home and for family members. Graduating students must submit their volunteer hours by **June 4** to ensure the community service graduation requirement is met.

### **ASPEN Student portal – course selection for 2021/22 school year**

Students can view their timetable, credit accumulation and course requests for next year on the Aspen student portal found on students' virtual commons. Students should review the courses they have chosen for next year on the 'my info' tab found at the top of the home page. Click on 'current schedule' and then click on the 'requests' tab found on the left. Students should contact their guidance counsellors if they would like to make changes to their course selections for next year.

Grade 12 students interested in returning next year should contact their guidance counsellor.

**Student Timetables for 2021/22** school year will be available in draft form on the students' Aspen portal by the end of the school year. Timetable/Teacher assignments may still change throughout the summer months. Final timetables will be made available at the end of August on Aspen.



## 2021 – 2022 Updated Uniform Policy

After input from students, staff and parents, we are adding a year-round golf shirt option to the Holy Cross uniform. HC green golf shirts can be worn with the HC pants, kilt, or shorts. Shorts are still restricted to the spring uniform later in the year. We hope this increases comfort level and available options, while maintaining the high standards and consistency a uniform embodies. The following is our revised uniform policy:

Students are to wear the Holy Cross uniform at all times during the school day, including the lunch hour and during spare periods. Uniforms are available for purchase through McCarthy's, our supplier, online-only this year.

The uniform has several functions: safety, convenience, cost and community. Visitors to Holy Cross are readily identifiable to staff, enhancing security in our building. Students essentially have one wardrobe decision to make in the mornings. The cost to families over time for clothing is reduced. The uniform takes into account comfort and equity. Students in uniform have chosen to be part of a community of equals and demonstrate their desire to be a Crusader by wearing the uniform with pride.

The fall and winter uniform is in effect from September to June.

The fall uniform is described below:

**Girls:** solid grey Holy Cross dress pants **or** the Holy Cross kilt with black tights. White Holy Cross crested blouse **or** green golf shirt.

**Boys:** solid grey Holy Cross dress pants; white Holy Cross crested dress shirt with school tie **or** green golf shirt.

**Optional:** School crested vest, pull over, zippered sweater or cardigan.

**Footwear:** no boots, no slides, no flip-flops, sturdy and comfortable casual dress shoes should be worn.

\*\*\*\*Students **may** wear a black long-sleeved shirt underneath the golf shirt, if needed.

The spring uniform option is in effect from May until the end of June. The shirts and shorts described below must be worn together: students are not to mix with the fall uniform.

**Unisex:** green school crested golf shirt and tan knee length Holy Cross crested walking shorts.

**Footwear:** deck shoes, running shoes, sandals are permitted.

\*\*\*\*Students **may** wear a black long-sleeved shirt underneath the golf shirt, if needed.

## Updated Uniform Policy cont'd

Students are deemed to be out of uniform if they do not have one or more components, including footwear, or, if they have accessorized the uniform excessively, including wearing any form of headgear, hood or hat. A student unable to correct an issue is out of uniform and will be issued a warning for a first offence and this will be noted in Aspen, our data collection system. If a student receives a second warning for being out of uniform, it will be noted in Aspen and a study hall will be issued and parents will be contacted. If a student receives a third warning, parents will be contacted and students will be either sent home to correct the problem or sent to the main office to complete their schoolwork for the day.

Non-uniform days are also governed by a dress code that requires students to refrain from wearing immodest, revealing clothing and/or clothing with inappropriate design/language promoting drugs, alcohol, or sex. **Changing clothes in the halls is not permitted.**

Support is provided to students throughout this process through the main office. Should there be needs, they will be addressed separately and not pursued as an issue requiring discipline. Nothing is more important than having students in class, learning. However, persistent and willful violations of the Holy Cross uniform policy will be interpreted as an unwillingness, on the part of parents and/or students, to join our school community, and may result in exclusion from school.

As always, common sense will prevail in the application of discipline as it relates to the school uniform. Communication between students and staff is paramount and will almost always result in a satisfactory resolution of any issue related to uniform. Your support for the policy and cooperation in ensuring it succeeds in keeping our school safe, convenient, cost effective and unified is appreciated.
