

# Dual Credit Course Information - Winter Semester

## Dual Credit Application Process

1. Study the course offerings and discuss with your parents which courses interest you the most. **You should have a first and second choice.**
2. Make an appointment with your guidance councillor or Mr. Murphy **before the end of October** to discuss your application. If the SLC course can fit into your Holy Cross schedule, you will be given an application form to complete and **submit by November 2<sup>nd</sup> at the latest.**
3. Mr. Murphy will submit your on-line application before the application deadline of November 3<sup>rd</sup>.
4. Students will be notified of their acceptance into a dual credit course for the winter semester by Mr. Murphy once confirmation is communicated by St. Lawrence College staff in late November or early May.

## Course Offerings

There are two types of Dual Credit courses offered in the winter semester at SLC:

1. **Congregated courses** - students are high school students from the Kingston schools. These courses are taught at the college by a college instructor. They follow the high school semesters (September to January and February to May or June).
2. **Integrated courses** - high school students and "regular" college students are in the same class. They follow the St. Lawrence College semesters (September to December and January to April).

## Winter Semester Congregated Courses (February 201 - May/June 2017)

### Addictions

Will examine the causes and impact of addiction to drugs and other substances on society. An elective course in Behavioural Science Technology, Social Service Worker and many others.

### Communications

Gives students the skills to organize and express ideas in a clear, correct, mechanically sound, professional manner. A required course in many SLC programs including Pre-Health, Paramedics, Social Service Worker, Business Administration, Office Administration, Game Development Technician and General Arts & Science

### Career and College Success

Designed to help students transition to higher learning. Covers items like money management, maintaining wellness, stress management, managing emotional problems and learning difficulties. A required course in many SLC programs.

### Pre-Apprentice Carpentry

Prepares students to take the OYAP carpentry program.

### Welding

Designed to provide the student with the knowledge and ability to set-up and operate oxyacetylene and arc welding equipment to weld, braze, solder and cut safely, and to specifications.
