We remember mothers who are separated from their children because of war, poverty, or conflict; May they feel the loving embrace of our God who wipes every tear away.

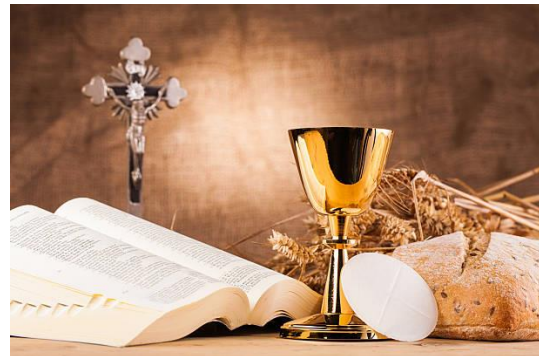
We pray for women who are not mothers but still love and shape us with motherly care and compassion.

StopGap Project

In addition, we are very pleased that School Council is supporting the work of our school's ME to We initiative. St. Martha Parent Council is excited to let you know about an opportunity that was presented to us at a council meeting called *StopGap*. The *StopGap* School Project involves education centered around disability, accessibility, and inclusion for the elementary school grades. Core lessons include the community accessibility audit, outreach to local businesses with single stepped entryways, and painting and delivering ramps! This learning adventure gets students out of the classroom and into their school's local neighborhood.



We are excited for the education components of the program and the continued teaching of Me to We thinking about equity and inclusion. School Council is pleased to support the school's efforts to fundraise this spring by way of a Little Caesars Pizza Order and Milkshake days in June. All money raised will go directly to

StopGap and their goals to educate about accessibility and help some Kingston businesses open their doors to everyone!

StopGap Project

During the 2018-19 school year, St. Martha will be working with the *StopGap* Foundation that aims to create a



world where every person can access every space. *StopGap*'s initiatives help inspire a shift in thinking about the importance of universal access and inclusion. St. Martha School Council and school community will be working with the Foundation to help the Kingston community learn more about the benefits of barrier-free spaces.

In the fall of 2018-19, classes will begin to learn more about disability, accessibility, and inclusion in our own community. Staff and students will be involved in completing a community accessibility audit, work with local businesses with single stepped entryways, and paint and deliver ramps by the end of the school year. St. Martha is the first school outside the GTA to commit to this targeted outreach, education, and painting and delivering of wooden ramps for businesses with one-step entrances. As leaders, the St.

Martha community will be educating business owners about the importance of a barrier-free environment. As community members, staff and students, we will deliver much-needed education regarding the importance of a storefront that everyone can access.



Through this project, students will be actively engaged in their community, demonstrating *Faith in Action* to those in need in the local community. This Social Justice initiative is in keeping with, and builds on, our work that recognizes St Martha as a "Me to WE" school. Thank you for supporting a wonderful learning and faith-based opportunity for the St Martha community! It is through our faith in God, love of others, and service to all that we make a difference in our community!

During the week of May 7st to May 11th, 2018 the Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board will celebrate the significant contribution that Catholic

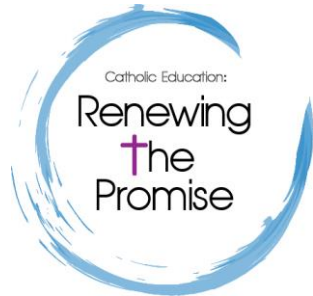
Education has made to the community, the province and to Canada. Our Catholic Graduate Expectations invite students to articulate in society those fundamental values that underpin Catholic education.

This year's Catholic Education Week theme is, ***"Renewing the Promise"***. The theme for CEW 2018 draws upon previous documents on Ontario Catholic education, namely, "This Moment of Promise" (1989), "Fulfilling the Promise" (1993) and "Our Catholic Schools" (2006-2007). These three documents, while several years apart from each other, all speak of the unique mission of Ontario Catholic education, the importance of its shared leadership by all those involved in Catholic education and the critical role of Catholic education in contemporary society.

Catholic Education Week 2018 combines the themes of reconciliation, solidarity, love, justice and ecology.

There are five sub-themes, one for each day of Catholic Education Week and they are aimed at helping staff and students to reflect more fully on what *Renewing the Promise* means to them. The five sub-themes are:

- Day 1: Remembering the Promise
 - Day 2: The Promise is Within You
 - Day 3: Praying the Promise
 - Day 4: Living the Promise
 - Day 5: Proclaiming the Promise
- Catholic Education Week is marked by special activities at all grade levels, including prayer celebrations and service activities.

Work taken on by staff and students this year has been a real labor of love and commitment to being stewards of the earth. Some of this work has included:

- Weekly Class ECO Rep meetings

Kindergarten Registration and Open House

*Stacking blocks and mixing sand and water encourages logical mathematical thinking, scientific reasoning and cognitive problem solving...the learning that occurs is a by-product of play (Paul Cappon, Canadian Council on Learning).

*Play is thinking time for young children. It is language time. Problem solving time. It

is memory time, planning time and investigating time. It is the organization of ideas time when the young child uses his mind and body and social skills and all his powers in response to the stimuli he has just met (James L. Hymes: Child Development and Research Specialist).
