# GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- SIX “4U” or “4M” level courses – check individual Universities
- OSSD (Ontario Secondary School Diploma)
- 30 credits with ALL compulsory credits
- 40 hours of Community Service (Get this done!!)
- Literacy (Test or Course)
- Be careful of repeated courses (retake ENG4U – counts once)
- Make sure Summer School courses are reported

- You will be assigned a PIN (late October/early November)
- All applications **MUST** be completed by Christmas break
- There is a fee of \$150 to apply to 3 program choices. Each additional choice is \$50.



# COLLEGE DEGREE PROGRAMS

## Examples

- Business Administration

- Apply through Ontario Colleges by OUAC  
deadline: January 11, 2017
- \*\* Collaborative degree/diploma programs

# What marks do universities look at?

- See Grade 11 and 12 marks
- Grade 11 marks are used primarily for early acceptance
- Emphasis is placed on final marks of first semester (4U and 4M) and midterm marks of second semester – typically top 6
- Must maintain minimum requirements to hold your spot

# Applying Outside of Ontario

- Applications to other provinces can be found on the individual school websites
- Some Out-of Province Universities will access marks through OUAC (e.g. Bishop's, UBC, Dalhousie, McGill)– others require transcripts to be sent
- Be sure to watch for due dates (usually around March 1<sup>st</sup>)

# Scholarship/Bursary Information

Scholarships – Awards based on academic and extra-curricular merit. Do not need to be paid back.

Bursaries – based on financial need. Do not need to be paid back.

Loans – Required to be paid back. Eg. OSAP
